Outbreak Situation - Screening

 Education Provided to Visitors

Policy Statement:

To respect the rights of our residents and allow visitation with any person of his or her choice, including consensual physical contact between a resident and the visitor.

The community may not require visitors to submit proof of any vaccination or immunization as a condition for visitation.

Action Steps:

- The Executive Director (ED)/designee will allow in-person visitation in all of the following circumstances, unless the resident objects:
 - a. End-of-life situations.
 - b. A resident who was living with family before being admitted to the community's care is struggling with the change in environment and lack of in-person family support.
 - **c.** The resident is making one or more major medical decision(s).
 - **d.** A resident is experiencing emotional distress or grieving the loss of a friend or family member who recently died.
 - e. A resident needs cueing or encouragement to eat or drink which was previously provided by a family member or caregiver.
 - **f.** A resident who used to talk and interact with others is seldom speaking.
- 2. It is the responsibility of the **ED/designee** that residents may visit with any person of his or her choice, at any time.
 - **a.** In the event of an infectious outbreak, the number of visitors per resident may be limited.
- Upon arrival to the community the visitor is required to check in at the Concierge desk.
- 4. The Concierge/designee will inform the visitor if there are any screening protocols that need to be completed due to the presence of an infectious outbreak within the community.
- 5. In the case of an infectious outbreak, it is the responsibility of the **ED/designee** that:
 - a. Signage will be posted informing visitors of an outbreak and the need for any screening, masking, infection control protocols, personal protective equipment, or other required actions.
 - i. Visitation of ill persons is discouraged.
 - **b.** Visitors will:
 - i. Complete screening, as required based on status of the community with any infectious outbreak.
 - **ii.** Follow all posted signage, the community infection control and masking protocols.

- **6.** The **ED/designee** may require a visitor to agree in writing to follow the community's' policies and procedures.
- 7. The ED/designee (under the direction of the ED) may suspend in person visitation of a specific visitor if the visitor violates the community's policies and procedures.
- 8. Should community visitation be required to be restricted (for example during a health emergency such as a pandemic), the ED/designee will inform residents that the resident may designate a visitor who is a family member, friend, guardian, or other individual as an essential caregiver.
 - a. The essential caregivers do not provide resident care, but may provide simple, just in time assistance to the resident, for example walking with them to the bathroom, putting on a sweater or setting up items for a meal
 - **b.** The designation of an essential caregiver will be documented in the resident's record.
- 9. The ED/designee will allow in-person visitation by the essential caregiver for at least 2 hours daily in addition to any other visitation authorized by the community.
- **10.** The **ED/designee** is responsible for ensuring that team members and visitors adhere to the community's policies and procedures.
- **11.** The **ED/designee** is responsible for making the policy accessible through the community's website.
